ST. THOMAS/ST. JOHN DISTRICT BEACH ADVISORY

The Department of Planning and Natural Resources (DPNR) announces that the Beach Water Quality Monitoring Program, which evaluates weekly water quality at popular swimming beaches throughout the St. Thomas/St. John District by sampling for Enterococci, Bacteria and Turbidity, which is a measure of water clarity, advises the public of the following:

DPNR performed water quality analysis at 18 designated beaches during the week of July 4 – July 8, 2022. The following beaches meet water quality standards and are considered safe for swimming and fishing:
