**BEACH ADVISORY**

The Department of Planning and Natural Resources (DPRN) announces that the Beach Water Quality Monitoring Program, which evaluates weekly water quality at popular swimming beaches throughout the Territory by sampling for Enterococci, Bacteria and Turbidity, which is a measure of water clarity, advises the public of the following:

DPRN performed water quality analysis at 34 designated beaches throughout the Territory during the week of August 1 – August 5, 2022. The following beaches meet water quality standards and are considered safe for swimming and fishing:

**Please note: Samples were not collected on the following beaches due to the presence of extensive sargassum seaweed:**

- *Frenchman's Bay on St. Thomas*
- *Columbus Landing on St. Croix*
- *Princess (Condo Row) on St. Croix*
- *Grapetree Bay on St. Croix*

*Therefore, the water quality at these beaches is unknown.*

DPNR will continue to monitor impacted areas and waters.
